Dan Smoke tells listeners about a First Nations leader who supports the use of Native names and terms for sports teams, going against the Washington Post article read aloud earlier in the show.

DAN SMOKE: [Inaudible] uses the **Seminole** name and mascot and wants the tradition to continue. The tribe has strong ties to the university, and even has given financial support to the sports program. So, there's one dissident First Nations leader who is going against the tide in supporting the use of a Native name for a sports team, which seems to indicate that we don't have total unity and we will probably never achieve total unity on this subject because it's just something that...I mean, you don't have total unity on any given subject amongst the white populations, so you can't really expect it to happen amongst the Native populations.
